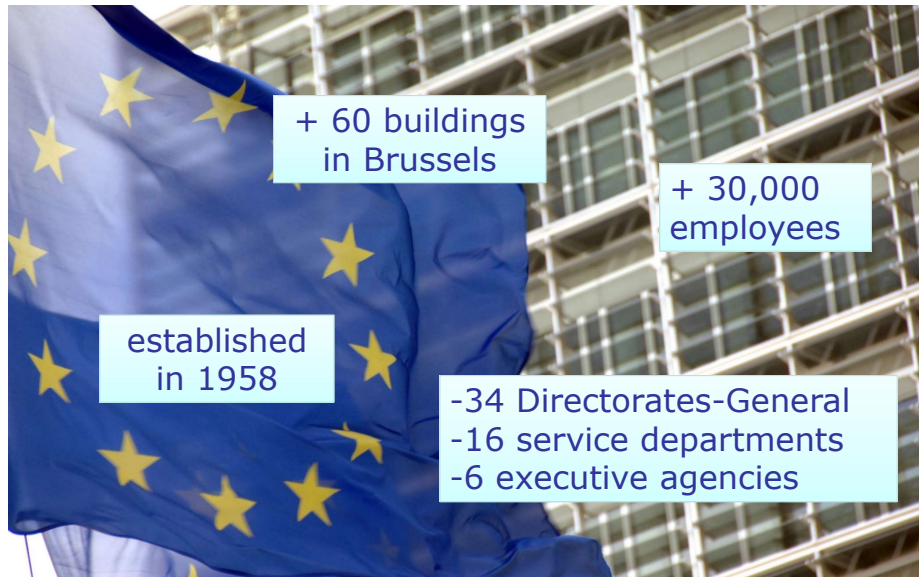

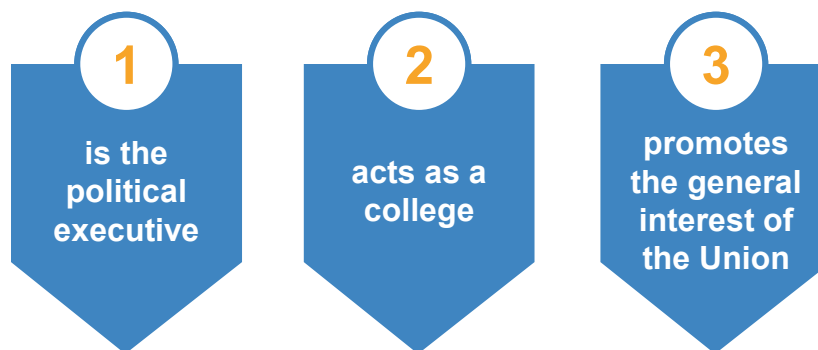

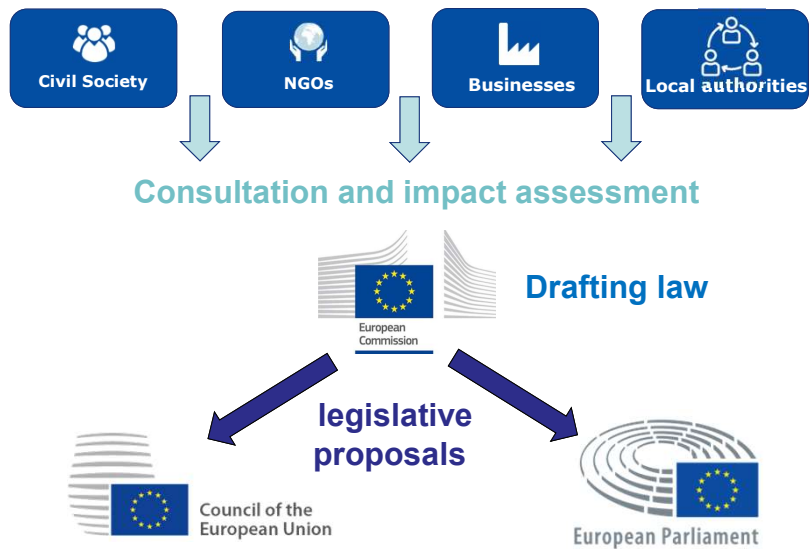

How countries, people and businesses benefit from the 2021-2027 EU budget

New priorities require new funds

The EU budget combines **resources** at European level.

As well as funding the **EU's priorities**, it finances **big infrastructure and research projects**.

EU budget also helps fund responses to challenges that go beyond its borders, such as the **coronavirus pandemic**, **climate change** and the **threat of terrorism**.



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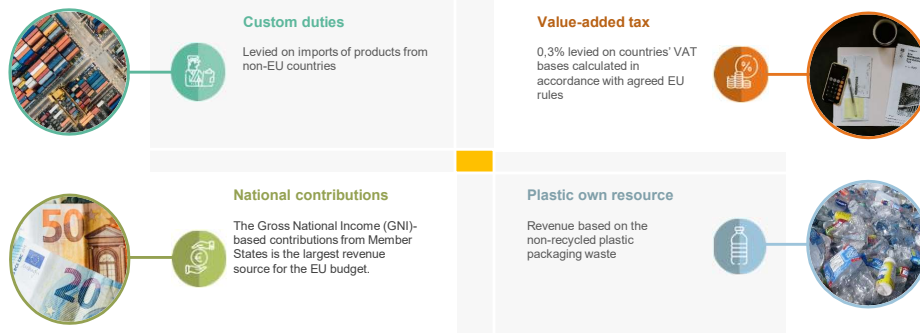
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EU budget: Where does the money come from?

Next Generation EU

30% of long-term budget and NextGeneration EU will be spent on **fighting climate change**

The European Commission is leading the recovery post-COVID. Europe will become **greener, more digital and more resilient**.

a minimum of **30 %** of expenditure for **CLIMATE** investments and reforms

a minimum of **20 %** of expenditure to foster the **DIGITAL** transition

20% of the Recovery and Resilience Facility Funds will be invested in the EU's **Digital Transformation**

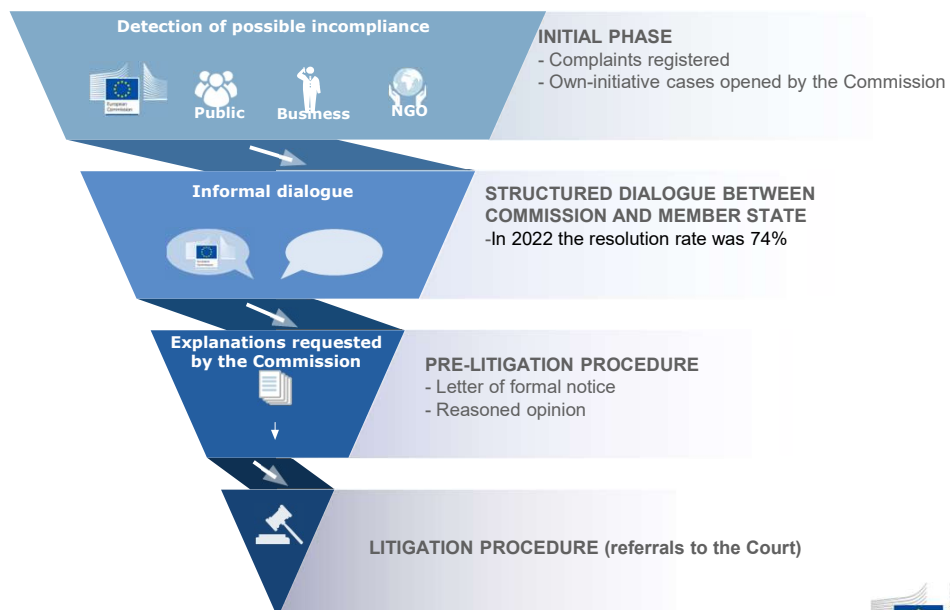

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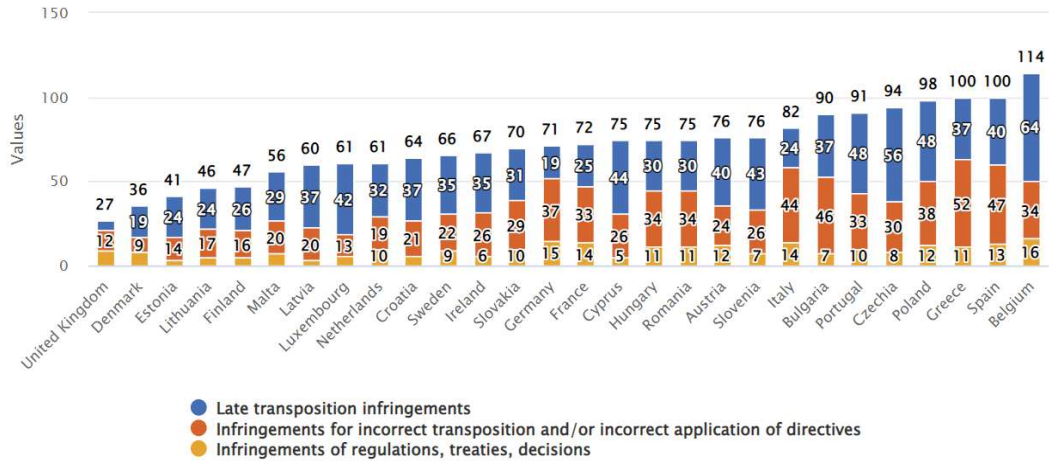
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Guardian of the treaties / Member States

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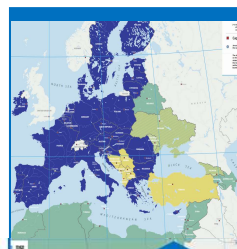

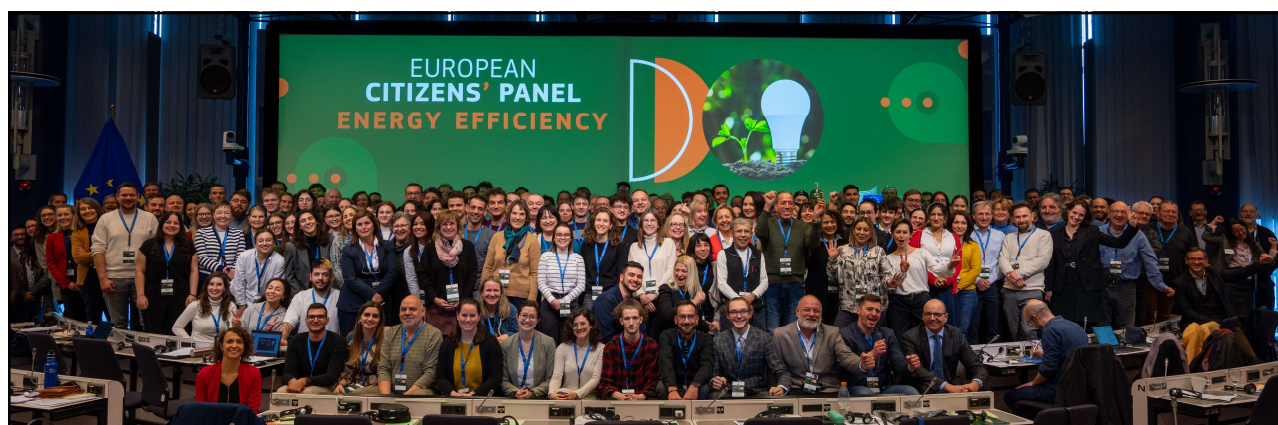

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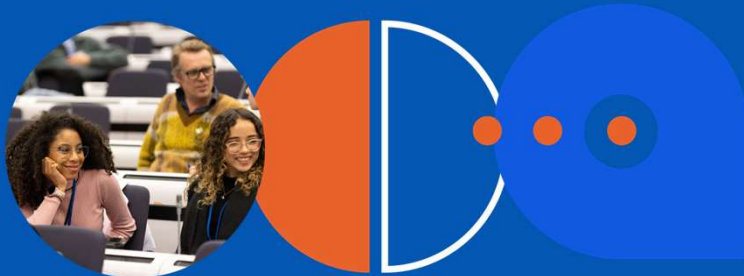
Where do we stand on citizen engagement?

- Delivering on proposals from the **Conference on the Future of Europe**.
- A **new ecosystem** of citizen engagement:
 - European Citizens' Panels and other participatory formats.
 - Have Your Say portal as an online one-stop-shop to impact policymaking including the **Citizens' Engagement Platform**
- New Generation of **European Citizens' Panels**
 - **150 randomly selected citizens deliberate on topics of EU importance.**
 - In 2023, Panels on the topics of **Food Waste, Learning Mobility, and Virtual Worlds.**
 - Two 2024 panels confirmed so far on **Energy Efficiency** and **Tackling Hatred in Society!**



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European Citizens' Panels



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What are they?

- **Democratic innovation!**
- **Citizens' Panels** are a deliberative format where citizens collaborate on **common solutions** on a topic (complements representative democracy).
- Different from COFE – only linked to the **European Commission**.
- Panels contribute to the first stages of **EU policy-making**.



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Participants

- **150 citizens, randomly selected.**
 - Random phone calls and, occasionally, door-to-door.
- **Must represent the EU diversity:**
 - Gender
 - Age
 - Socioeconomic background
 - Level of studies
 - Rural/Urban areas
- **1 in 3 participants aged 16 – 25** 



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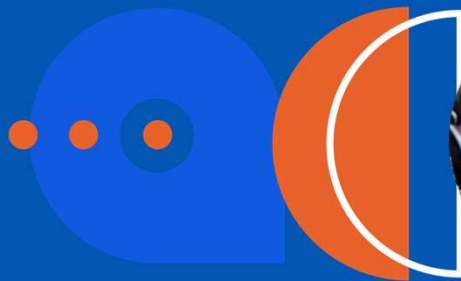
How do they work?

- **3 weekends**
 - Two in person - in Brussels
 - One in an interactive online environment
- Participants are divided in **12 working subgroups. Facilitators** and **experts** help in their discussion.
- The working groups discuss priorities for action and draft **recommendations**.
- Recommendations are presented in plenary, **participants vote on them to show the level of support**
- The recommendations are taken into account in the policy initiative and adopted by the College as a **Citizens' report**.



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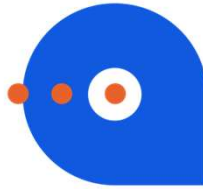

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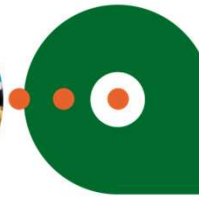
Intro to the Citizens' Engagement Platform

What is it?
A multilingual digital platform for citizens.



Main goal
Allow all citizens to share their ideas and concerns.

Commission's use
Provides services with an online tool to support participatory and deliberative processes.



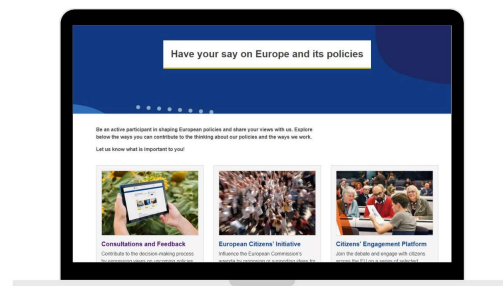
Multilingual
Shows multilingual content and enables interaction in the 24 official EU languages.



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Have Your Say Portal

- The Portal is part of the **new ecosystem** of democratic citizen engagement. R(0)
- Its launch follows citizens' proposals in the Communication released after COFE.
 - **One of three gateways** of the revamped
- Have Your Say portal:
 - Public Consultations and Feedback
 - European Citizens Initiative
 - **Citizens' Engagement Platform (CEP)**

How does the Commission use the Platform?

- The Platform offers enough **flexibility** and **customisation** to adapt to each process.
- **2 ways** the Commission can use the platform:
 - Feeding into European Citizens' Panels or other participatory formats
 - Fully-online citizen engagement processes.
- * Processes are independent (with their own topic, start and end date, and possibility to be managed by a different EC service).



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A tool for the citizens

- **Why is the Platform important?**
 - Contributions will **directly feed into the discussions** of Citizens' Panels.
 - This is your chance to get involved in EU policymaking, by sharing your ideas with us!
- To be meaningful, **the Platform needs many active citizen contributions**
- So, what can you do about it?
 - Spread the word and help others to join the debate!**
